4. TALES OF WOE AND WHIMSY: THE WORK OF JAN JOHNSON

Some of the large body of work created by the late Jan Johnson throughout his time at his Pascoe Rd home is being shown at the Sooke Region Museum under the title "Tales of Woe and Whimsy". The show runs from October 23rd 2015 to March 31st 2016 and is open during regular museum hours. The Sooke Region Museum and Visitors Centre is open 9:00 am – 5:00 pm Tuesday through Sunday, closed Mondays and Statutory Holidays.

Jan Johnson was a well-loved local character that made his home out beyond Sooke since the early 80's. He first lived out in Shirley and had many stories of volleyball and other community events at the Shirley Hall, as well as tales of interesting times at the Jordan River pub and good finds at the Jordan River dump (an important place where many pieces of sculpture originated from. The stories Jan told painted a vivid picture of what it was like in the area beyond Sooke in the 80's and 90's. From Shirley, Jan moved to Otter Point and created a "weird home" that is infused with art that he shared with his wife Mary Alice Johnson. A true local character, you would be hard pressed to find someone with such a unique combination of brilliance, insight, humbleness, keen observation and creative execution that Jan possessed.

Jan left behind an amazing body of unique work. We are fortunate for that and also very fortunate that Mary Alice Johnson is passionate about Jan's work and wants to continue to share it with the world and allow us all to continue to get to know Jan through his work.

A book of Jan's art is in the works and hopefully more shows will follow. Mary Alice is still searching for more of Jan's pieces that people own that she doesn't know about so if you have one, or know of one please let her know mary@almfarms.org.
