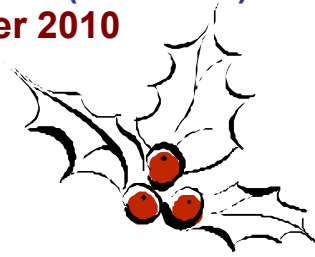

### **3. BUDGET FIGURES FOR THE JUAN DE FUCA ELECTORAL AREA**

As part of a continuing effort to find ways to improve governance in the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area (JDFA), Regional Director Hicks and OPSRRA Director Wayne Fritz have collaborated on the first ever profile of the JDFA budget. This document will be posted to the OPSRRA and [JDFA web sites](#) by the end of December. Included in the documents are a detailed explanation of how our taxes are arrived at, the JDFA budgets for 2009 and 2010 and the projected budget for 2011.

The work involved in preparing this document and ensuring its accuracy was considerable and OPSRRA wishes to thank those involved for taking on this important task.

### **4. OPSRRA MEMBERSHIP MEETING**

OPSRRA held its fall membership meeting on November 28, 2010. Submitted reports follow:

#### **Summary of OPSRRA Activities since the March 2010 Membership Meeting**

1. OPSRRA directors held 7 monthly meetings.
2. Prepared and sent eight monthly newsletters to about 290 members by email, an increase of about 30 since the March AGM.
3. Continued to add local businesses to the web site's Business Services listings. We now have 34 listings.
4. Continued to up-date the OPSRRA web page ([www.opsrra.ca](http://www.opsrra.ca)) and added a new feature which includes background papers related to the OCP reviews for Otter Point and Shirley/Jordan River.
5. Maintained 24 Community Notice Boards in Otter Point.
6. Wrote Minister of Rural & Community Development in support of keeping 3 year term for Regional Directors, School Trustees and appointments to commissions.

7. Wrote the Chair of the JDF Land Use Committee to express concerns and request clarification about the process used to gather public comment re the Marine Trail Holdings Group rezoning proposal.
8. Met with representatives from Western Forest Products and TimberWest/Couverdon Real Estate concerning community issues related to their properties and logging operations.
9. Meet with provincial Cabinet Ministers re local concerns arising from the release of WFP private forest lands from TFL 25 and the subsequent conditional purchase of some of these lands for CRD parks.
10. Met with representatives of the off-roading community re their desire for a dedicated place in our area for motorized recreational vehicles.
11. Met with some residents of Jordan River to explore expanding OPSRRA into their community.
12. Met with our MLA and Ministry of Transportation re road maintenance issues in our area.
13. Met with Ministry of Transportation staff and the JDF Economic Development Commission re possibility of placing Welcome to Shirley & Otter Point signs along Highway 14.
14. Attended a meeting with the regional director and JDF Planning Services staff re governance options.
15. Organized a Town Hall Meeting with local area elected representatives.
16. Attended JDF Parks, JDF Land Use Committee and Advisory Planning Commission meetings.

## 5. JUAN DE FUCA COMMUNITY TRAILS SOCIETY MONTHLY WALK: IN HONOUR OF ADMIRAL JOHN A. CHARLES

The Juan de Fuca Community Trails Society submitted the following story to the OPSRRA newsletter:

This month's hike is on Saturday, December 4, 2010 and is in honour of the late Rear Admiral John A. Charles.

This is a two hour walk on the forestry roads of Royal Roads University. These woods are one of the last remnants of intact Douglas-Fir Forest.

We will meet in the main parking lot below Hatley Castle at 9:30 a.m. There is a fee for parking.

The Admiral (Rear Admiral John A. Charles (March 1918-September 2010) was one of the first members of the Juan de Fuca Community Trails Society. He was

Commandant of the Royal Roads Royal Canadian Naval College in the 1950s. In retirement he worked hard to ensure that the college remained an institute of higher learning when the college became surplus to the military requirement. Partly because of his efforts, the college became Royal Roads University. He worked to preserve the gardens and grounds. He lived in Otter Point since retiring from the navy in the 1970s. He was active in the community. He was a board member of OPSRRA; he served on the Otter Point and Shirley Visioning Committee and regularly attended meetings of the JDREA Parks and Recreation Commission and JDREA Land Use Committee. He delighted in letting his neighbours use the many trails on his land which he operated as a managed forest. He was producing lumber from the deadfalls on his property until the very last day. We will really miss him in Otter Point.

## 9. UPDATE: OTTER POINT OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN REVIEW

The long awaited review of the Otter Point Official Community Plan (OCP) is now underway. An eleven-person Citizens Advisory Committee, chaired by Arnie Campbell, has been established. Its task is to develop a report with recommendations that will be used by CRD planning staff to develop a draft OCP, which will then be reviewed and amended (or not) by the Juan de Fuca Land Use Committee and then sent to local agencies and the Otter Point Advisory Planning Commission for final comment before going to public hearing and being enacted as a bylaw by elected CRD officials.

The initial phase of the advisory committee's work plan is to identify community issues and opportunities that might be addressed in a new OCP. A community mapping information meeting was held on November 20. Two advisory committee meetings and an invitational community workshop on key issues such as land use, roads, trails, drinking water, the environment and development permit areas are scheduled for December and January.

The middle and final phases of the committee's work plan are, respectively, to explore policy options and to draft a final report containing recommendations. A mix of advisory committee meetings, general public meetings, and community workshops is planned to assist the committee in carrying out those tasks. The Citizens' Advisory Committee encourages and welcomes the public's involvement and participation in this important review process.

## 11. DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

### **Kemp Lake in Otter Point was incorrectly identified on provincial maps and records as Clyde Lake in the early 1900s?**

Kemp Lake was named for Richard Kemp who farmed the area in the late 1800s. A subdivision plan dated 20 May, 1914 for 10 lots with cabins on the south side of the lake identifies the lake as Clyde Lake. A query to the BC Geographical Names Office revealed the following:

This lake was first labeled Kemp Lake on the BC Lands map of South-eastern Districts of Vancouver Island in 1895. It was described as a small lake just to the northeast (in Lots 41 & 42, Sooke Land District). It was then mislabeled "Clyde Lake" on the 1911 edition of the BC Lands map and again in 1929 on the T.N. Hibben & Company map of South-eastern Districts of Vancouver Island.

The origin of "Clyde lake" is unknown. Any help trying to solve the mystery would be appreciated.

This month's **Did You Know That?** was prepared with information provided by Otter Point resident Heather Phillips and information obtained from the BC Geographic Names Office.
