3. KEMP LAKE FORESHORE RECREATION PROJECT AT MILLIGAN ROAD

The Juan de Fuca Electoral Area Parks and Recreation Commission has posted the following announcement on their web site:

The CRD, Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations, Fish and Wildlife Branch and the Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation are collaborating on a project to improve the Milligan Road foreshore access to Kemp Lake in support of recreational sport fishing and other recreational activities. The project is to be funded through grants and donations.

A public information meeting is scheduled to be held at the Otter Point Fire Hall on Wednesday, February 8 from 4 to 8pm, 3727 Otter Point Road.

Note: The Ministry of Forests, Lands and Resource Operations discussed the proposal with the Kemp Lake Water District (KLWD) last April. The KLWD responded that they support the improvements and “are quite supportive of environmentally safe uses of the lake”.

The OPSRRA newsletter included the following story about the proposal in its May 2011 edition:

The provincial Ministry of the Environment (MOE) has been encouraged by freshwater recreational sports fishing organizations such as the Freshwater Fisheries Society of B.C. to consider improved boat launching, dock, parking and picnic facilities at the end of Milligan Road on Kemp Lake. The purpose of these proposed site developments would be to reinvigorate and promote freshwater recreational sport fishing with youth and adults and provide a range of recreational opportunities on the lake. This proposal is still in the development stage and needs discussions with the Kemp Lake Waterworks District which holds a water license on the lake and provides drinking water from the lake to about 450 households in the area. Consultation with the broader community will be undertaken by the JDFEA Parks & Recreation Commission once they have received a detailed plan of the provincial proposal. The MOE would be taking the lead to develop the plan and would pay for all of the proposed facilities. If the plan was approved the JDFEA Parks & Recreation Commission would then apply to the Ministry of Transportation, who presently own the foreshore access, for a permit to manage the site as a JDFEA recreational facility. The provincial report explaining the site development proposal will be available on the Otter Point Official Community Plan web site following the OCP Review Committee's May 4th meeting. 5. OTTER POINT EMERGENCY SERVICE COORDINATOR HAS A QUESTION

Al Wickheim, Otter Point Community Coordinator for the Juan de Fuca Emergency Measures Program, submitted the following to the OPSRRA newsletter:

Fellow Otter Point residents:

Recognizing this is not a complete representation of the Otter Point Community I shall none the less put this question forth for your consideration. As you may be aware I, as Community Coordinator for our district as part of the Juan de Fuca Emergency Management Program, am working at jump-starting the Pod, community self rescue / self sufficiency network. More can be found on this at the Otter Point F/D website under Public Info.

I would like to place, with appropriate permissions and the community's consideration, small (5 x 10 in") reflective signs at the Pod boundaries where visible from the road. These would be green and white and flexible to secure to variety of surfaces. The purpose would be multi-fold - bring awareness of the Pods to the community at large, identify for residents of any given Pod their Pod #, and make assistance both emergent and less urgent more easily provided and located.

I recognize that signage can be considered eye-pollution and that not everyone will agree with the idea. Please send me a note if you will with your support or concerns with this concept and any ideas or alternatives you have in mind.

6. TELECOMMUNICATIONS TOWER PROPOSED FOR OTTER POINT

Telus recently announced that it is proposing to locate a telecommunications tower in the Sooke Business Park in Otter Point. OPSRRA contacted the Senior Communications Manager for Telus for details.

The approximately 49 metre (150 foot) high tower would be located at the back of the Business Park in the vicinity of the present outdoor storage area. This is a

\$500,000 project to improve and extend cell phone and wireless communications coverage to parts of Sooke and Otter Point with a western boundary of Kemp Lake Road.

Telus said that they are responding to an increase in requests from their customers for better cell phone coverage west of Sooke. Some of their customers are residents of the local area but others are tourists, people working for delivery companies and other businesses who travel to or through the area and expect to be able to access cell phone and other wireless communications. In addition to the new tower being planned for Otter Point, Telus is also looking for a suitable site for the Shirley area.

7. DFO INTENDS TO DECOMMISSION A DAM ON DEMAMIEL STREAM

The federal Department of Fisheries & Oceans (DFO) recently announced its intention to decommission the Bill James Dam on DeMamiel Stream. The dam is located in the Rural Resource Lands about 5 kilometres north of Otter Point. It was built by DFO in 1988 on Percy Brown Swamp and rebuilt in 2001. It helps control the flow of water in the stream during those times of the year when fish are present. The dam is one of three built for this purpose; the others are at Bradford Swamp, operated by the Minister of the Environment and at Young's Lake, operated by the Sooke Salmon Enhancement Society (SSES). The SSES depends upon these dams to regulate water in DeMamiel Stream to enhance the survival rate of Coho salmon, native trout and steelhead fry. The SSES was offered the choice of taking-over the cost of operating the dam but the expense of installing a new valve, maintenance, establishing a road for emergency access and liability insurance was over \$100,000 and beyond their resources as a non-profit society.

The water behind the dam covers an area of about 14 Ha (34 acres) and is on land owned by TimberWest. Neither DFO nor TimberWest wants the liability associated with maintaining the dam. DFO has already dismantled the valve that controls the flow of water from the dam and now wants to remove the dam during the summer of 2012.

OPSRRA has an interest in this matter for three reasons:

- We support efforts to maintain DeMamiel Stream as a fish-bearing resource in our community. Its flow levels are exceedingly low in the months of July and August. These flow levels could be further depleted under local climate change predictions.
- There are 15 known water licenses on DeMamiel Stream; thirteen are domestic licenses and local households could be affected by a decrease in water flowing in the creek during the summer months.
- DFO did not notify major stakeholders. OPSRRA undertook to ensure that stakeholders were aware of the intent to decommission the dam. Only SSES knew. DFO did not inform Scouts Canada, which maintains Camp Barnard on Young's Lake; the T'Sou-ke First Nation, which include the area of the dam in their traditional territory or the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area Regional Director.

Regional Director Hicks wrote a letter to the provincial Ministry of the Environment expressing concern with the decision to decommission the dam and asked for a meeting with the Ministry and DFO. John Horgan, MLA wrote both the federal Minister of Fisheries and the Regional Water Manager for the provincial Ministry of the Environment asking that the decision to decommission the dam be reconsidered. OPSRRA has also written a letter requesting that the decision be reconsidered.

Although the deadline to file objections was 30 January 2012, this date may be extended at the discretion of either DFO or the Ministry of the Environment. 9. REPORT: SOOKE REGION MUSEUM GENERAL MEETING

The Sooke Region Historical Society, operator of the Sooke Region Museum and Visitor Information Centre, held its Annual General Meeting on January 29, 2012. The society operated on a budget of \$340,080 in 2011, compared with \$354,139 in 2010 and had a small profit of \$13,776 in its overall operation, helped in part by increased fund raising and gift shop revenues and the position of executive director being vacant for a couple of months. The operation of the museum is supported by donations, fund raising, gift shop revenues, sale of memberships, exhibition fees, government grants and a an annual tax levy of \$126,000 from the residents of the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area and the District of Sooke.

10. SOOKE TRIATHLON ANNOUNCES COMMUNITY LIAISON

The organizers of the annual Sooke Triathlon (which now takes place mostly in the communities of Otter Point, Shirley and Jordan River) have announced the appointment of a local race director who will act as a liaison with the community: Dr. Matt Mortenson (m.mortenson@triserries.ca).

This year's race will take place Sunday, August 12, 2012. The route is anticipated to be the same as last year's with a swimming start at Young's Lake (Camp Barnard) in Otter Point, followed by a bike race from Camp Barnard, along Otter Point Road to Gordon's Beach, then along West Coast Road through Shirley and Jordan River and concluding with a foot race in Sooke. The Olympic Distance event at the triathlon will be a Canadian Age Group Team qualifier for the 2013 World Championships in London.

The Sports Network (TSN) will be filming the West Coast Road portion of the bicycle race again this year. The resulting program will be televised later in the year and will include shots of the Sooke and Juan de Fuca areas.

11. JUAN DE FUCA ELECORAL AREA GRANTS-IN-AID

The Juan de Fuca Electoral Area (JDFEA) has a budget for discretionary grants that allows the Regional Director to respond to requests from organizations and agencies which provide a service to residents of the JDFEA. These grants are recommended by the Regional Director and approved by the Electoral Area Services Committee of the Capital Regional District Board. The 2010 budget for grants-in-aid was \$40,710 and a request for \$38,500 was in the 2011 budget. This year's amount not be known until after is approved by the CRD in April. This budget item is usually underspent. For example only \$22,500 of the 2010 allocation of \$40,710 was spent and last year \$38,500 was approved and \$13,300 was spent. The Regional Director tries to disburse these discretionary funds in proportion to the population of each of the sub-areas in the JDFEA. 12. DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

The B.C. Hydro power line through Shirley and Otter Point was relocated in the 1970s? The power line was originally installed between 1909 and 1911 by the V. I. Power Company for the B. C. Electric Company to provide electricity to the growing City of Victoria. In later years, as other sources of power were brought to the Island from the Mainland, the Jordan River Generating Station's grid was reduced to supplying power to the communities west of Victoria. The Jordan River facility was rebuilt in 1971 and is now capable of supplying 170 Mega Watts of electricity; enough to meet the needs of our local area as well as that of Sooke and Colwood.

When the construction of Diversion Dam and the Jordan River power house began in 1909 the only way to get to Jordan River was by boat. However, as the new power lines were installed a road was necessary and by 1912 the first cars were able to make the trip from Sooke to Jordan River with the newly installed power lines visible from the road. The original lines were on cedar poles located in a right-of-way from Jordan River to Sooke which followed the northern edge of West Coast Road to Gordon's Beach and then the north-west side of Otter Point Road through to Sooke. Remnants of that route can still be seen on maps as long streaks through properties where the right-of-way is still identified. Part of the abandoned route ran through what is now William Simmons Park on Poirier Lake in Otter Point.

The new B. C. Hydro right-of-way is situated north of the original route and no longer visible from Highway 14 but still passes through residential communities in Otter Point. The power lines are easily recognized and used by the province to define No Hunting/No Shooting boundaries from Sooke to Jordan River. The new right-of-way is also used by off-roaders venturing into the Rural Resource Lands.

This month's **Did You Know That?** was prepared using information from a 1935 Department of National Defence map and *The Sooke Story: The History and the Heartbeat*, written and published by the Sooke Region Museum.
