- Capital Regional District, Building Inspection Department (invited); potable water requirements and rainwater capture design.
- Vancouver Island Health Authority (invited); water quality and potability standards.

As mentioned in last month's OPSRRA newsletter, rural communities such as Shirley and Otter Point have some special water issues and OPSRRA is interested in organizing a forum on water sometime in the fall. This month's JDF Planning Services forum will help to answer some of the commonly heard questions, but there are many others such as:

- Would different water sources (private wells, private water cisterns, stream/land collection systems and community water systems) have different quality and quantity issues?
- How do you protect water sources from contamination or "fix" contamination?
- What type of filtration systems work best and are most cost effective?
- What should we know about current and pending provincial acts, local government bylaws, water licenses, permits and testing standards?
- What can be done when there are actions or activities affecting our individual water supply such as our property's potential for flooding or erosion?
- What are the new building codes suggesting for "grey water" re-cycling?

- How do we individually and collectively protect our local watersheds and water cycles? How do we incorporate these protections into our Official Community Plans?
- Do we need a local “water help process” that someone could contact when their water supply is inadequate? We have lots of local talent and experience, but no formalized way to share the knowledge and expertise.

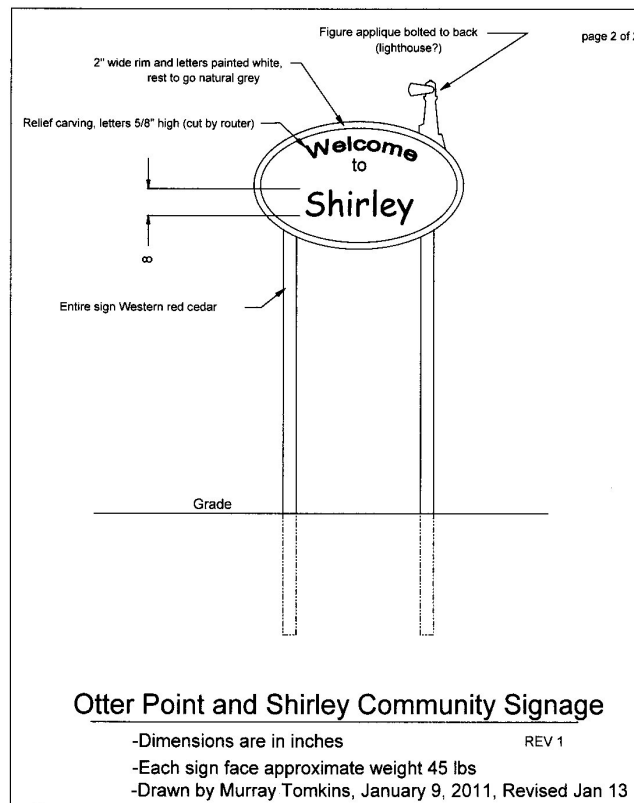

3. UPDATE: WELCOME TO SHIRLEY AND OTTER POINT SIGNS

OPSRRA is continuing its efforts to secure funding for two *Welcome to Shirley* and two *Welcome to Otter Point* signs for Highway 14. One sign would be located at the Otter Point border with the District of Sooke, two at Muir Creek (on opposing sides of the posts) and one just west of Shirley in the Jacobs Creek/Sandcut Creek area. These signs will help to identify our community to both local residents and visitors. The establishment of attractive, highly visible community identification signs in Otter Point and Shirley will complement the Pacific Marine Circle Route information website and assist tourists in locating local accommodation, food and recreational services, parks and points of interest.

Our budget for designing, constructing and installing four high quality signs, which meet Ministry of Transportation standards, is \$4,600. Thus far we have raised the equivalent of \$3,000 through cash and kind donations. Individuals or businesses interested in helping us raise the remaining \$1,600 can contact OPSRRA directors Fiona McDannold, Wayne Fritz or Arnie Campbell.

The signs will be made from Western Red Cedar with the wording routed out of the face, as shown in the following drawing.



4. UPDATE: HIGH SPEED INTERNET COMING TO SHIRLEY

Last August, the OPSRRA newsletter reported on a successful effort by some residents of Shirley to replace their slow TELUS dial up service, as well as an expensive satellite system, with a high speed Internet service. This came about with the assistance of Broadband Canada which announced in July 2010 that an application by Shaw Cable Systems Ltd. to provide Internet service to Shirley has been conditionally approved with the cost of the hook up being paid for by Broadband Canada. Shaw Cable Systems is now clearing trees along West Coast Road and it is anticipated that the Shaw Internet line, which presently ends in Otter Point, will be strung this summer and the Internet service will be available by December 2011.

Broadband Canada is a federal program whose objective is to reach as many unserved and underserved Canadian households with access to broadband services (1.5Mbps) at reasonable cost. According to their web site, the program provides essential infrastructure to Canadians in rural and remote areas, allowing them to participate in the Internet economy by accessing information, services and opportunities that would otherwise be out of reach.

Note: TELUS also provides high speed internet service into the eastern part of Shirley; up to and including Invermuir Road.

5. WILLIAM SIMMONS PARK OFFICIALLY OPENED

The long awaited opening of William Simmons Memorial Park on Poirier Lake in Otter Point was held on Saturday, May 21, 2011. About 80 local area residents attended the event officially opened by Louise Paterson, Chair of the Juan de Fuca Parks & Recreation Commission; Mike Hicks, Juan de Fuca Electoral Area Regional Director; John Horgan, Juan de Fuca MLA and Randall Garrison, Esquimalt/Juan de Fuca MP.

The 15.29 acre park was six years in the planning with an initial purchase of 5.09 acres of land along the shore of Poirier Lake by the Sooke and Electoral Area Parks & Recreation Commission (SEAPARC) in 2005. This was followed by the purchase of an abandoned 3 acre hydro right-of-way in 2006 and the donation of 7.2 acres of land to the CRD by Eric Sellar-St.Clare in 2007. It was Mr. Sellar-St.Clare's wish that the park be named in memory of his long-time friend William Simmons.

The park's transition to public use began two years ago and included community consultation and visioning work by the JDF Parks & Recreation Commission and CRD Parks. A community clean-up of the area was organized in June 2009 and the construction of trails, parking lot, pavilion and view points followed. Financial support for this work came from the JDF Parks & Recreation budget, the JDF Community Trails Society and the Canadian Horse Council. A park volunteer group has recently been established and one of their tasks will be restoration work (removing invasive species) as well as maintaining popular exotics or propagating native vegetation. The Sooke Saddle Club has also offered volunteered to maintain and keep clean the equestrian facilities in the field area.

6. DIRECTOR HICKS ANNOUNCES CANDIDACY

Municipal and regional director elections are scheduled through-out the province for November 2011. The Juan de Fuca Electoral Area (JDFEA) which includes the communities of Port Renfrew, Jordan River, Shirley, Otter Point, East Sooke, Willis Point, the Malahat as well as the Songhees (View Royal), Esquimalt and T'Sou'ke (Sooke) First Nation lands will be voting for one director position to represent the JDFEA on the CRD Board of Directors. Because the JDFEA is an unincorporated area the CRD Board is our local government.

Director Mike Hicks has filled the position of JDFEA regional director since the November 2008 election and appointed Wally Vowles from Otter Point as his alternate. Director Hicks has informed the OPSRRA newsletter that he intends to run for a second term and that if successful he will reappoint Wally Vowles as his alternate.

In addition to representing the Electoral Area at the CRD Board, the regional director or his alternate also sits on the following committees and commissions: CRD Electoral Area Services Committee, Regional Water Supply Commission, Juan de Fuca Water Commission, C.R.E.S.T. , Vancouver Island Library Board, West Shore Parks and Recreation Society, West Shore Owners (occasionally), SEAPARC, Mount Matheson Water Commission, Juan de Fuca Parks & Recreation Commission, JDF Land Use Committee, Port Renfrew Utilities Commission, Juan de Fuca Economic Development Commission and the five fire department commissions (occasionally).

Each year the chair of the CRD Board canvasses all of the CRD directors as to what CRD regional committees they would like to work with and directors are expected to select at least two. The main committees are: Regional Parks; Regional Water; Planning, Transportation and Protective Services; Environmental Sustainability and Finance & Corporate Services. Director Hicks presently serves on the Parks and Water committees and intends to request a seat on the Parks and Finance committees if re-elected.

Note: The CRD Board of Directors recently approved an increase in the remuneration for Electoral Area regional director positions because of their workload. The new salary is \$39,886 and will take effect January 1, 2012.

7. KEMP LAKE WATERWORKS CORRECTION

The May OPSRRA newsletter contained incomplete information about the treatment of the water from Kemp Lake used in the Kemp Lake Waterworks District water supply. Water testing is done on a weekly basis for piped water and ***raw water is treated with a full analysis in the spring and fall.***

9. UPDATE: OTTER POINT OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN REVIEW

The Otter Point OCP Review Committee met weekly through the month of May to discuss and identify goals and prepare their recommendation regarding changes to the Otter Point Official Community Plan. They also met with representatives from the Kemp Lake Waterworks District and the Otter Point Fire Department.

Some of the significant issues that need further discussion are density, where development should be considered or not, extending water and fire protection to areas presently not serviced by the Kemp Lake Waterworks District, minimum lot sizes, whether clustering should be encouraged and alternatives to 4 on 10 developments.

A meeting scheduled for 6:00 pm on Wednesday June 1, 2011 at the JDF Planning Services Office 2-6868 West Coast Road, Sooke, will likely conclude the committee's draft recommendations to JDF Planning Services. A date to present these draft recommendations to the Otter Point community for comment has not been established.

10. WHAT WAS COOKING 100 YEARS AGO

Recent interest in eating food grown at home, or at least closer to home, wouldn't seem that new to First Nation and European settlers who lived in this area 100 years ago. The OPSRRA newsletter intends to replace the 100 Mile Diet with the 100 Years Ago Diet! We have begun collecting cookbooks, recipes and other items related to food and will start our new series next month. If you have information about what local area residents might have been grown, cooked or eaten about 100 years ago let us know. We'll also be working with the Sooke Region Museum to add some names and local history to the 100 Years Ago Diet stories.

Next month we'll explain the connection between famous early Victoria photographer Hannah Maynard (1834-1918) and a 1891 cookbook that ended up in Jordan River.

11. DID YOU KNOW THAT ...

The Panama Logging Railway line ran through the present day William Simmons Memorial Park? A 1935 Department of National Defence map shows the route of the abandoned rail line that followed DeMamiel Creek and Otter Point Road from Sooke.

Logging railways began in Sooke in 1905 and by 1912 the Canadian Panama Timber & Logging Company Ltd. had extended its line up the DeMamiel Creek Valley and into the DeMamiel Creek watershed with logging camps at Poirier Lake near the corner of present day Young's Lake and Otter Point Roads and on Tugwell Road near Goudie Road. By 1920 the Canadian Panama Timber & Logging Company had seven miles of track, one locomotive, two work cars and fourteen railway cars (or trucks) to haul logs to a saltwater dump in Sooke Harbour. The company was bought-out by a Seattle lumber company in 1920; the line was eventually abandoned in the early 1930s.

The new trail from the William Simmons parking lot (next to the Sooke Business Park) through to the main park area has been named the Panama Trail in recognition of the history of the park's connection to the history of the area 100 year ago.

Information in this month's Did You Know That? came from *4,000 Years A History of the Rainforest* written and published by the Sooke Region Museum.
