2. APPOINTMENT OF OPSRRA SECRETARY/TREASURER

OPSRRA directors have approved the appointment of Emma Taylor as Secretary/Treasurer for the balance of the 2006/2007 term. This position remained vacant after the February AGM elections. Emma moved to Otter Point last summer and joined OPSRRA in the fall. She is presently attending the University of Victoria as a Masters student in Geography with an interest in local governance and community development related to waste management.

In addition to serving as a director, the Secretary/Treasurer has principle responsibility for the following tasks:

- ◆ Acting as the association's Treasurer and keeping the association's accounts.
- ◆ Maintaining the Association's membership list.
- ◆ Keeping track of all the association's documents.
- ◆ Ensuring that Annual Reports are prepared.
- ◆ Booking meeting space.

3. RURAL MAILBOXES

The process to replace our present rural mailboxes with the newer ones began more than five years ago. In the beginning, Canada Post said that house numbers in the JDF Electoral Area would have to be updated before they would consider bringing the newer-style boxes into East Sooke, Sooke, Otter Point and Shirley. After numerous false starts and delays the JDF Electoral Area Civic Addressing Project was finally completed last fall. As a result, many residents of Shirley and some in Otter Point have had to change their address. So when are the new mailboxes arriving? Not soon, according to Canada Post: originally they were budgeted for this fiscal year and installation would have begun this summer. Now it may be 2007—or not. Apparently Canada Post now wants the District of Sooke to make some addressing changes before the project can go ahead. In the meantime the Electoral Area has to wait.

OPSRRA is writing Canada Post to express our frustration with the continuing delay. Residents of Shirley and Otter Point are encouraged to also write Canada Post. Letters can be sent to:

Some additional information that you should be aware of:

- ◆ Each new rural mailbox location will have its own Postal Code.
- ◆ Some box locations may be changed.
- ◆ The compartment spaces are slightly smaller
- ◆ The new boxes are installed on permanent bases to discourage tipping.

4. OTTER POINT & SHIRLEY FIRE SEASON BURNING REGULATIONS

Although this has been a cool and wet spring, it will only take a few hot days for the built-up areas around Shirley and Otter Point to become fire hazards again. This means an increase in the risk of fire spreading to homes, out-buildings and into the surrounding forest. If you think that wildfire can only happen elsewhere in the province you are fooling yourself! As our communities become more built-up the risk of careless burning increases.

Otter Point Burning Regulations

The following is summary of the 1958—Fire Regulation Bylaw No. 1, 1991 http://www.crd.bc.ca/bylaws/fireprotection_/index.htm

No open burning shall take place during the months of July, August and September.

No open burning between sunset of one day and sunrise of the next day.

Fire season is April 15 to June 30 and October 1 to October 15.

The season may be extended at the discretion of the Fire Chief.

All open burning requires a permit from the fire department: call 642-6211.

As this is a volunteer department, please leave a message and the person issuing permits will call you back.

Prohibited Materials

The following shall NOT be burnt:

Tires	plastic
drywall	paint and paint products
treated lumber	asphalt, asphalt products
rubber	fuel and lubricant containers
tar paper	railway ties
manure.	

No person shall ignite or maintain a fire on the foreshore:

- ◆ within 46 meters of any building;
- ◆ within 3 meters of any driftwood, dry vegetation, grass or any other combustible materials;
- ◆ or without obtaining a Class "B" burning permit.

Class B limits on hand pile burning shall be maximum diameter 2 metres or 6 feet.

No green debris or leaves shall be burnt except by specific exemptions which may be at the discretion of the Fire Chief

5. SEAPARC SERVICE REVIEW

The JDF Regional Director's April 2006 newsletter details forthcoming changes to how residents of the JDF Electoral Area will be taxed for the use of services provided by the Sooke & Electoral Area Parks & Recreation Commission (SEAPARC). The present taxation arrangement is based entirely on property assessment. This was considered to be unfair by the Electoral Area as property values in the Electoral Area are higher (on average) than in Sooke, while the District of Sooke has a larger population base using SEAPARC's facilities. After lengthy negotiations with the District of Sooke the following changes have been agreed to:

- ◆ In 2007 the calculation will be based upon 80% property assessments and 20% population.
- ◆ In 2008 it will go to 60% property assessment and 40% population.
- ◆ In 2009 it will go to 40% property assessment and 60% population.
- ◆ In 2010 it will go to 20% property assessment and 80% population.
- ◆ In 2011 it will be based entirely upon population.

It is estimated that the Electoral Area's share of the SEAPARC requisition will drop from the present 47% to 30% by 2011. More information is available on the Regional director's web site: www.crd.bc.ca/jdf/index.htm

- ◆ **Hike:** May 20 at 10 am, a 90 minute hike through the big trees at Muir Creek. Meet at Muir Creek parking lot, on the Sooke side of Muir Creek Bridge. Some steep sections. Meet at 2 p.m. on May 20 for a stroll down the beach to the fossil beds.

8. DID YOU KNOW?

This is a new feature for the OPSRRA newsletter. Send us your interesting (and hopefully little known) facts about Shirley and Otter Point. Do you have a question that you want answered? Let us know and we'll try to find the answer.

Information for Did You Know is based upon resource material produced by the Sooke Region Museum.

- ◆ **Did you know that most of present day Tugwell Road in Otter Point is built on the old Sylvania Logging Company railway line?**
Their #3 logging camp was located at the present corner of Tugwell Road and Goudie Road.
- ◆ **Did you know that Sheringham Point in Shirley was named after a surveying officer of the British Royal Navy in 1846?**
The Government of Canada built a lighthouse on the point in 1912. The light was so new, that on December 2, 1912, the master of the four-masted barque, Country Linlithgow, mistook it for Race Rock light, turned to port (left) thinking that it was headed for Esquimalt Harbour and ran aground at Gordon's Beach!

9. UPDATE ON A REQUEST FOR A GOVERNANCE STUDY FOR OTTER POINT, SHIRLEY AND JORDAN RIVER

As of May 1, there has not been a reply to the March 25 letter (see April's newsletter) sent to the Minister of Community Services requesting a response to the 453 petitions presented to the provincial legislature asking for a Governance Study for Otter Point, Shirley and Jordan River.

The District of Metchosin has applied to the Ministry of Community Services for permission to conduct a Boundary Restructure Study that would consider including East Sooke, The Malahat and the CRD watershed into the District of Metchosin.

Because of the limited amount of money available from the province for governance studies, it is possible that all of the money will go to the East Sooke, Malahat, Metchosin study and none will be directed toward a governance study for Jordan River, Shirley and Otter Point. The Assistant Deputy Minister with the Ministry of Community Services, responsible for Governance, stated in a March 23

e-mail to both OPSRRA and our MLA that the Ministry would be flexible on the terms of reference for a Juan de Fuca Electoral Area governance study and that the Ministry was committed to seeing that the interests of Otter Point, Shirley and Jordan River were included. Nothing else has been heard since.

10. UPDATE ON THE PROPOSED NEW SOILS REMOVAL AND DEPOSIT BYLAW

The Juan de Fuca Electoral Area Land Use Committee (LUC "A") will be considering a new Soils Removal and Deposit Bylaw 3297 for the JDF Electoral Area on Tuesday, May 2. OPSRRA Vice President, Jim Dexter, has been monitoring the development of the draft bylaw and will be presenting several suggestions on behalf of some Otter Point and Shirley residents.

11. UPDATE ON PROPOSED OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLANS AND ZONING BYLAWS

It is really difficult to provide up-to-date information on this topic in a monthly newsletter, as the circumstances change from day-to-day. However, this would seem to be the latest.

As a result of public criticism of parts of the Shirley/Jordan River and Otter Point Official Community Plans (OCPs) and the proposed Zoning Bylaws, the Regional Director has agreed to:

1. Not proceed with final approval of the Otter Point and Shirley/Jordan River OCPs.
 2. Include some of the suggested amendments in a new draft of the OCPs.
Note: In the meantime the previous Local Area Plan (Bylaw 2366) remains in effect.
 3. Publish a revised draft OCP Bylaw.
Note: This is now available on the JDF Electoral Area web site or from the JDF Office.
 4. Repeat the public consultation process, which should follow this format and may or may not include input from the OCP/Zoning Advisory Committees:
 - ◆ public review consisting of an Open House or Information Meeting;
 - ◆ review of public comments by Land Use Committee (LUC "A");
 - ◆ first and second reading by the CRD Board; (see note)
 - ◆ local Public Hearings in each community;
 - ◆ third reading by the CRD Board if no amendments are required;
 - ◆ approval by the Ministry of Community Services;
 - ◆ return to the CRD Board for fourth and final reading before becoming legal bylaws.
Note: The full CRD Board does not vote on JDF Electoral Bylaws. This is delegated to a committee of the Board that is made-up of the JDF Regional Director, the Mayor of Central Saanich and the Mayor of Metchosin. The composition of this Committee is the subject of a legal challenge that has been brought by four residents of the JDF Electoral Area.
- ◆ Redraft the draft Zoning Bylaws to include the changes proposed in the April 8 handout circulated at the JDF Electoral Area Zoning

Bylaw Open House.

Note: The CRD lawyers are reviewing these proposed changes and apparently are making “quite a few” recommendations.

- ◆ Commission accurate maps that will identify 2 and 4 Ha parcels (permitting “4 on 10” lots being written into a separate zone) and lots smaller than 1 Ha (to prevent the creation of any non-conforming lots within a zone).

Note: Because the Electoral Area needs to purchase this “in-house” CRD service, it may not have enough money to do all the required mapping.

It is entirely likely that the Riparian Area Regulations and the Wildfire Development Permit Areas will undergo major rewrites because of the problems that were encountered with the way in which these policies were written. The controversy over the 30 metre Development Permit Area for properties adjoining the Strait of Juan de Fuca will likely result in this being changed to a 15 metre setback

Note: There is a difference between a set back and a Development Permit Area [DPA]: you can't build at all in a set back area, you can build in a DPA if the application is approved.

If the 30 metre DPA is changed to a 15 meter set back, who assumes responsibility if someone builds (or re-builds) too close to the ocean and bank erosion, water surge, etc. damages their property? This might be a good time to check your insurance policy!

The Otter Point Zoning Advisory Committee is continuing to meet and has their next meeting scheduled for Wednesday, May 10 at 7:00 p.m. at the Otter Point Fire Hall. **There may be another Otter Point meeting on Wednesday, May 24.** Check the Sooke News Mirror on May 17 for an announcement. The Shirley/Jordan River Zoning Advisory Committee does not have any meetings scheduled, pending the completion of the mapping project previously referred to above.

The Shirley/Jordan River and Otter Point Official Community Plan, and now Zoning Advisory Committees, have been meeting for over two years. Attendance has ranged from none to perhaps a couple of dozen interested residents. With the recent and sudden controversy over some of the proposed zoning changes (especially the requirement of a Development Permit for construction within 30 meters of the ocean, streams or lakes; and the possibility of Rural “A” properties having to legally sub-divide to create “4 on 10”), the attendance shot up to nearly 100 at a couple of these meetings. This kind of awareness of local issues and attendance at the meetings is great. Keep coming though—otherwise don't complain about your opinion not being respected!
