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## **2. VICTOR BYRON TWEEDY 1931-2011**

Byron was a founding member of OPSRRA in 1992 and served as a director until 2005. Community activist, relentless letter writer and passionate supporter of Otter Point and its rural values; he will be missed by many in our community.

## **3. GOVERNANCE: OPSRRA MEETS WITH ELECTED REPRESENTATIVES**

In July the directors of OPSRRA wrote to the Hon. Ida Chong, Minister of Community, Sport and Cultural Development; Mr. John Horgan, MLA, Juan de Fuca; Mr. Mike Hicks, Juan de Fuca Electoral Area Regional Director; and Mr. Geoff Young, Chair, CRD Board of Directors. Our letter requested a round-table meeting concerning the future of governance in the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area. This meeting was organized with the help of John Horgan and held at Minister Chong's invitation on October 11, 2011.

One outcome of the meeting was a decision to have a committee of OPSRRA directors meet with senior staff from the provincial Governance Structure Branch to review OPSRRA's concerns regarding governance in the Juan de Electoral Area and submit recommendations back to the roundtable group early in the New Year. Depending on the outcome of these meetings and the decision of our elected representatives, a wider consultation with the residents of the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area will be sought. Some of the possible options for consideration are:

- A governance options study.
- Adding a second regional director to the JDFEA.
- Having an elected Community Council.
- The Union of B.C. Municipalities' idea of an elected Electoral Area Body.
- Changing representation at the CRD Board for residents on the urban First Nations lands in Esquimalt and View Royal from the JDFEA to a First Nations Director.
- Expanding the responsibilities of elected committees and commissions.
- The incorporation of all the JDFEA lands west and north of Sooke.

## **4. THE LAND CONSERVANCY AND JDFEA PARK LANDS PURCHASE**

The recent announcement that the Land Conservancy of B.C. (TLC) was unable to meet the deadline to raise \$1,000,000 towards the 2011 instalment for the purchase of former Western Forest Products lands at Jordan River and Sandcut Beach needs an explanation.

In 2010, in response to intense public pressure, the Capital Regional District (CRD) agreed to purchase 1,510 hectares of private managed forest lands from Western Forest Products at a cost of \$15,600,000 to be paid in three instalments over three years. The province contributed \$2,000,000 towards the purchase. The purchase

added critical lands to the Sooke Potholes Regional Park and created a new Sandcut Beach Regional Park, the first regional park west of Sooke. In 2012 recreational land at Jordan River will be included and preserved for public recreation.

With some encouragement from the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area Regional Director, the TLC became a supporter by agreeing to help raise funds towards the purchase of the Jordan River and Sandcut Beach lands and signing onto a conservation covenant. However, in an August, 2011 letter to the CRD the TLC advised that public response to its “*Wild Beaches and Hills*” campaign was disappointing and that they would not be able to contribute anything towards the second payment. Given this news, one news headline might be that the TLC has defaulted on its agreement; another might be: where has the community support for purchasing these recreational lands disappeared to?

Meanwhile, in addition to its own \$2,250,000 contribution, the CRD is also covering this year’s \$1,096,230 shortfall from its limited parks acquisition budget. The TLC says that it will keep trying to raise funds towards the 2012 instalment. It’s one thing for the community to demand that land in the JDFEA west of Sooke be brought into the public domain as parkland for public enjoyment; it’s another to follow-through with financial support for this when it happens. Because residents living on the View Royal and Esquimalt Indian Reserves are entitled to vote for the JDFEA Regional Director, there are two ways that you can calculate the percentage of voter turnout. If you include the approximately 1,000 View Royal and Esquimalt voters, the turn-out for the 2005 and 2008 election was about 29% in 2005 and 34% in 2008. If you remove them from the number of eligible voters, the turn-out for the remainder of the Juan de Fuca Electoral Area was about 36% in 2005 about 42% in 2008.

## 9. KEMP LAKE FORESHORE PREPARATIONS

Plans to install a boat launch, dock, parking and a picnic area on Kemp Lake at Milligan and Manatu Road are progressing. News of this was first reported in the May 2011 issue of the OPSRRA newsletter.

The provincial Ministry of the Environment (MOE) has been encouraged by freshwater recreational sports fishing organizations such as the Freshwater Fisheries Society of B.C. to consider improved boat launching, dock, parking and picnic facilities off of Manatu Road on Kemp Lake. The purpose of these proposed site developments would be to reinvigorate and promote freshwater recreational sport fishing with youth and adults and provide a range of recreational opportunities on the lake. This proposal is still in the development stage and needs discussions with the Kemp Lake Waterworks District which holds a water license on the lake and provides drinking water from the lake to about 450 households in the area. Consultation with the broader community will be undertaken by the JDFEA Parks & Recreation Commission once they have received a detailed plan of the provincial proposal. The MOE would be taking the lead to develop the plan and would pay for all of the proposed facilities. If the plan was approved the JDFEA Parks & Recreation Commission would then apply to the Ministry of Transportation, who

presently own the foreshore access, for a permit to manage the site as a JDFEA recreational facility. The provincial report explaining the site development proposal will be available on the Otter Point Official Community Plan web site following the OCP Review Committee's May 4 meeting. Since then, a site visit was conducted in August by the Parks & Recreation commissioners and a Qualified Environmental Contractor. A report is now being prepared to determine the potential impact on the environment of the proposed facilities. Once completed, the report will be used as part of the bidding process to determine the cost and timing for the project. The Ministry of the Environment will then submit a final proposal to the Parks & Recreation Commission for comment and recommendations. Public consultation will be required as part of the approval process. If approved, work would likely begin in 2012 or 2013.

## **10. SHIRLEY FIRE COMMISSION**

The Shirley Fire Commission submitted the following:

As OPSRRA members know, providing good, solid local services is critical to rural residents. The Shirley Fire Commission, officially the Shirley Fire Protection & Emergency Response Services Commission is a community organization that ensures that residents and property owners in the Shirley Fire District are involved in providing effective, quality fire and emergency response services. The Commission helps set the property tax levy that finances the operation of the fire department. It ensures the fire department has the resources to provide quality service effectively, consistent with the standards set by the Provincial Fire Commissioner.

The Commission looks to area residents to help with its role by seeking out interested people to participate in managing fire department financial resources. Commissioners, once nominated by members of the community, are appointed to the Commission for two year terms by the Board of the Capital Regional District. Every year, three members must be appointed/re-appointed to the Commission for a two-year term. Currently, the Shirley Fire Commission has three vacancies that need to be filled by community nomination.

To qualify for nomination, nominees have to be property owners or residents of the Shirley Fire District. It is not necessary to have knowledge of fire fighting or emergency response to be a Commissioner; knowledge of the community, of the need for fire protection and of prudent budgeting of funds and an interest in helping to manage our Fire Department are important. Operational and functional knowledge can be gained through participating on the Commission. Typically, service on the Commission involves attending a two-hour meeting, once a month, throughout the year.

To ensure that Shirley continues to have community ownership, input and control of its fire department, the Commission is in need of community volunteers for nomination to the Commission. Commission nominations are brought forward annually at the Commission's Annual General Meeting. This year the AGM will be held on Sunday, November 20, 2011 at 2:00 PM at the Community Hall. Anyone interested in becoming a member of the Commission or who wishes to know more about what service on the Commission

entails, is encouraged to contact the Chair of the Nominations Committee, Gerard LeBlanc, at 250-646-2791; cell: 250-896-6491 and discuss their interest with him. Please leave a message if Gerard doesn't answer; voicemail is available at both contact numbers and he'll return your call promptly.

## 11. JORDAN RIVER COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION FORMED

Twenty residents of Jordan River came together at the Shirley Community Hall on Saturday, October 22 to establish a community association for Jordan River. The group had been meeting informally for the past year and will now apply to the province for registered status as a non-profit society. The purpose of their society will be:

1. To ensure that Jordan River's development takes place in an orderly way and in the best interest of its residents;
2. To ensure that development in areas surrounding Jordan River does not negatively impact the best interests of the residents of Jordan River;
3. To co-operate with local government and other public bodies to further Jordan River's objectives and benefits to the community;
4. To promote community spirit and sense of identity by organizing or supporting appropriate activities.

The new association's first task will be to determine support for expanding the Shirley Fire Protection District to include Jordan River and what this would cost local taxpayers.
